

Interdisciplinarity in the Future of Law and Economics

The welcome session of the SIDE-ISLE Conference 2019 focuses on the interdisciplinary dimension of Law and Economics.

The session begins with a *Workshop* focused on how to stimulate interpersonal collaboration between lawyers and economists. The workshop mixes online and offline, and participants have ample opportunity to engage with the speakers.

The workshop is followed by the presentation of a recent *Global Jurist* **Special** *issue* on Calabresi's *The Future of Law and Economics,* in which the reflection on how to nourish interdisciplinarity is paramount.

18.30: Welcome Cocktail

The purpose of the workshop is to *stimulate collaboration* between economists and lawyers on topics of common interest. A first way to stimulate collaboration is training individual scholars in both disciplines. This is the model predominant in the US context. A second way to address the issue is the creation of the institutional space for *interpersonal collaboration* between economists and jurists. This second approach reduces the individual investment in interdisciplinarity drastically but raises additional challenges.

Workshop: Stimulating Collaboration

The intuition animating the workshop is that there is a potential for interpersonal collaboration in a European, and especially Italian context. The *challenge* is, therefore, identifying the institutional barriers to this collaboration and finding ways to reduce them.

The workshop activity can be divided into three main phases:

• A *preliminary phase*, taking place online, where each participant will be asked to share their views about interdisciplinary collaboration (and lack of), to shed some light on 1. Where we stand, 2. The Obstacles we face in collaborating, 3. Areas of that would benefit from collaboration, as well as sharing 4. Tips about best practices. • A *roundtable*, where experts will share their views about the abovementioned points, followed by a horizontal discussion where the various participants will have ample space to brainstorm about the promises of and challenges to interpersonal collaboration.

• The event will conclude with the inauguration of *LawEconCollaborate*, a Google Group designed to facilitate the meeting of economists and jurists who are willing to engage in interpersonal collaboration. Presentation of the Special Issue: "On The Future of Law and Economics by Guido Calabresi. An Interdisciplinary Dialogue"

Global Jurist, 3/2019 (De Gruyter)

Guido Calabresi's book, The Future of Law and Economics, has drawn a substantial amount of attention among Law and Economics scholars. Calabresi's historical-conceptual standpoint allows him to isolate the stakes of different future developments around the question of how could further appreciation of legal institutions that defy the standard economic assumptions help the field develop theoretically. Overall, the contributors all shared Calabresi's attempt to restore the balance between Law and Economics and the need to better account for the "whole unanalysed experience of human race", often neglected by the Economic Analysis of Law approach. Most disagreements are about the 'how'. In any case, the search for the Law and Economics 'not (yet) taken' or for other "Law and ... " approaches is always open to the Future.

In the Roundtable, invited speakers will share their view about Calabresi's attempt to restore the balance between Law and Economics, derive further insights from the Special Issue and make concluding remarks.

Keynote Speakers

Kaushik Basu (Cornell University) is Professor of Economics and the C. Marks Professor of International Studies at Cornell University. From 2012 to 2016, he served as Senior Vice President and Chief Economist of the World Bank (2012-16).

He has been editor of *Social Choice and Welfare*, and serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Economic Perspectives*, *Journal of Development Economics*, and *World Bank Economic Review*.

He is currently President of the International Economic Association (2017-2020). He was (the fourth) President of the Human Development and Capabilities Association, which was founded by Amartva Sen. He has held advisory posts with the ILO and the World Bank. He has held a visiting position at the Institute for Advanced Study (Princeton), and he was a distinguished visitor at the London School of Economics, and a visiting professor at Harvard University (Economics dept.), Princeton University (Economics dept.), and M.I.T. (Economics dept.). He has received several honorary degrees, including doctorates from IIT Bombay, Fordham University and Bath University.

Kaushik Basu has published widely in the areas of development economics,



industrial organization, and welfare economics. He has also contributed popular articles to magazines and newspapers, such as *The New York Times*, and he has appeared on various television programs including CNN (USA), NDTV and CNBC (India) and BBC. In May 2008 he was awarded one of India's highest civilian awards, the Padma Bhushan, by the President of India.

Professor Basu will deliver a keynote speech on his book titled "<u>The Republic of Beliefs.</u> <u>A New Approach to Law and Economics</u>" (Princeton University Press, 2018) that highlights the limits and capacities of Law and Economics and proposes a fresh way of thinking about more effective laws and a fairer society.

Keynote Speakers

Katharina Pistor (Columbia Law School) is the Edwin B. Parker Professor of Comparative Law at Columbia Law School and Director of the Law School's Center on Global Legal Transformation. Prior to joining Columbia Law School, Pistor has held academic positions at the Kennedy School of Government (Harvard University), and the Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Law in Hamburg. She has held visiting positions at several universities, including University of Pennsylvania Law School, New York University Law School, Frankfurt University, London School of Economics, Oxford University, and Harvard Law School.



In 2012 she was co-recipient (with Martin Hellwig) of the Max Planck Research Award on International Financial Regulation; in 2014 she received the Allen & Overy Prize for the best working paper on law of the European Corporation Governance Institute. She is also the recipient of research grants by the Institute for New Economic Thinking and the National Science Foundation.

In 2014 she was elected president of the World Interdisciplinary Network for Institutional Research, and in 2015 member of the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy of Sciences.

Her research spans corporate law, law and economics, property rights, and comparative law and legal institutions. She has published widely in legal and economic journals.

Professor Pistor will deliver a keynote speech on her most recent book titled "The Code of Capital: How the Law Creates Wealth and Inequality" (Princeton University Press, 2019) that explores the different ways that financial products and economic profits are coded to give advantage to their holders.



Stefan Grundmann (EUI) holds the chair of Transnational Private Law at the European University Institute. He is on leave from Humboldt University where he is a Professor of Private and Business Law. He has held chairs of German and International Business Law at the universities of Halle-Wittenberg (1995-2001) and Erlangen-Nürnberg (2001-2004) before he went to Humboldt-University in 2004. He has been visiting professor at King's College London, at the Rome I University, 'La Sapienza' and LUISS, at Oxford and Cambridge University, at Herzlya University (Tel-Aviv), at N.Y.U. and Harvard University.

He is (co-)editor of several journals including the "European Review of Contract Law" (editor-in-chief).

He is founding president and current president of the Society of European Contract Law (SECOLA), president of the Luso-German Lawyers Association, cofounder and president of the steering committee of the European Law School and director of several institutes in the universities where he holds or held chairs. He is member of the board of the German Society of Comparative Law, head of the section 'Fundamental Theory', and as such also member of the International Academy of Comparative Law (Académie Internationale de Droit Comparé). Moreover, he is member of the European Law Institute and also member of its council.



His research interests include contract law, company and banking law, legal theory, always including comparative and European Private Law.

Prof. Grundmann will deliver a keynote speech on theory of regulation of financial markets and contracts.
